

LINE CLASSES Entry Fee \$50.00/Class

All classes will be shown on the triangle as per CWHBA handbook. Except for the Foal Futurity – The line classes are open to any horse that is registered with (or eligible to be) CWHBA or one of the breeds recognized by Agriculture Canada.

1. Larry Rollins Memorial CWHBA Foal Futurity

Check the CWHBA web site for the list of the 2009 participating SSA Stallions. Open only to foals sired by a Nominated Stallion of the 2009 CWHBA Stallion Service Auction. Owners of nominated stallions are entitled one free entry. For foals which result from a successful bid in the auction, the entry fee is waived. Entrants are required to submit a copy of registration papers. If not registered, foals must be identified prior to the class, and can be done for free by the assigned Veterinarian (Saturday and Sunday Morning only.) If your foal is already identified, you only need to present this paperwork with your entry forms. Please note on entry if identification is required. Weanlings may be shown with mare; they will be allowed to be turned loose to help show their movement.

2. Open Breed Weanling Line Class - Same as above, but for weanlings of stallions who were not entered in the CWHBA Stallion Service Auction. Not to cross enter with class #1.

3. Showmanship Challenge (Any Breed) \$30.00

Handlers to show their horses in hand and on the triangle pattern, all ages welcome! Great opportunity to practice skills for those Young Breeders!

4. Young Horse Hunter Material Class – Horses to be judged under saddle for suitability for hunter disciplines, Horses may be asked to jump under saddle up to two foot 3 " at discretion of judging panel. Horses should be in their first year of showing.

5. Young Horse Material Jumper Class - Horses to be judged under saddle for suitability for jumping disciplines, Horses may be asked to jump under saddle up to two foot 6 " at discretion of judging panel. Horses should be in their first year of showing. 4 Yr Old – 2'9 Max 5 yr old- 3'0 Max - 6 -7-8 yr 3'6 ft max

6. Young Horse Material Dressage Class – Horses are judged under saddle for dressage suitability, walk, trot and canter, with simple changes of direction, lengthening at the discretion of the Judging panel. . Horses should be in their first year of showing.

7. Open Chute Jumping Special A chute of not less then 3 jumps with one to two oxers is used to evaluate the scope and technique over fences. For more details see the Riding Horse Test section. Open to Mares, Geldings and Stallions of any Registered Breed, horses of any age or training may participate in this class. Practice Run on Friday night or Sat. am. *Riding Test Horses are automatically entered in this competition.* Entry fee: \$70/horse

8. Riding Horse Test Entry Fee \$125.00

A wonderful opportunity for you to have your horse scored by a panel of experienced judges. A valuable marketing and breeding tool! Owners must be current CWHBA member. Open to mares, geldings and stallions of any registered breed, 3 years of age and older, but not be under saddle for more than 6 – 12 months.

Gaits and Rideability under saddle: Horses are ridden in groups of not less than three, in school order maintaining a one or two horse length separation. A few minutes is given at the beginning for warm up. Riders will be given directions by the judges to demonstrate trot, lengthened trot, canter, lengthened canter, walk and sitting trot. Only simple figures will be required including large circles, change of rein across the diagonal and space permitting a three-loop serpentine or change of rein from one circle to another.

Test Rider Phase: An independent test rider rides each horse in all three gaits noting the following qualities: comfort in gaits, suitability of gaits for sport competition, responsiveness to the aids, attitude or disposition of the horse towards the rider, acceptance of the bridle and willingness. The test rider will take into account the horse's age and level of training (length of time under saddle) to make an assessment and assign a score. The test ride should take approximately five minutes but the test rider should take enough time to make a fair assessment

Chute Jumping Phase: A chute of not less than three jumps is used to evaluate the scope and technique over fences. Striding should be comfortable, usually one stride between jumps with one or two oxers. Height will be increased gradually and the final height will vary from horse to horse depending upon the ability demonstrated. Owners may have input regarding the height of the jump their horse will show to the best advantage. Free jumping may take place prior to or after the under saddle phase at the discretion of the organizers. *Results have no influence on future licensing or approval of stallions.

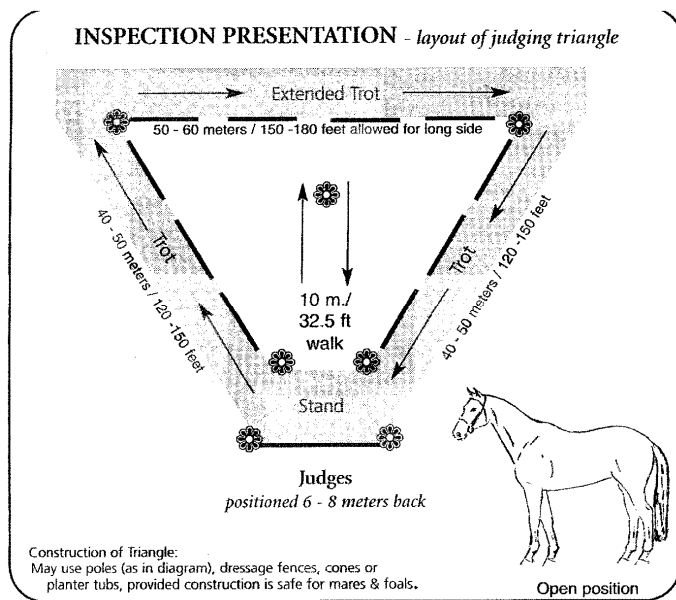

9. Mare Evaluation Fee \$100.00

Mares must be evaluated before being entered in the studbook, and are examined at 3 years and older in hand and shown on the triangle pattern. Mare inspections are required for: Thoroughbred, Arabian and Anglo-Arabian mares for upgrading to Pre- Book II All Warmblood mares born 1992 and thereafter entering any of the CWHBA Mare Books. (Exception- mares, which have been graded by their own Warmblood breed, may apply for entry at \$30.00). Owners must be current CWHBA members. Original and a copy of registration papers are required at time of evaluation. Inspection is optional for Auxiliary Book mares. Inspection for grading is a service for our breeders and it is worthwhile to help you make some breeding decisions. SHOW RULES

1. The show will be conducted according to guidelines provided by the CWHBA handbook. The Show Committee reserves the right to amend or add to the rules or decide any point not covered by these rules and to correct any errors or make any necessary alterations in the rules, prize list or program. Make Entries Payable to: SWHBA
2. Horses may cross-enter any or all classes EXCEPT where stated in the prize list.
3. Please sign the Release and Waiver of Liability form and return with entry form and fees. Competitors will not be issued numbers until waivers are received in the Show Office.
4. Neither Pelmac Stables or SWHBA will be responsible for loss of tack, equipment or injury to horse and/or rider.
6. Horse and rider must present themselves in proper attire. RIDERS MUST WEAR HARD HATS AT ALL TIMES WHILE MOUNTED.
7. At the discretion of the Show Committee, a class may be cancelled or combined if fewer than five entries are received.
8. Entries Close Mon Aug 16, 2010..
Post entries accepted at the discretion of the Show Committee.
9. Exhibitors cancelling their entries after the official closing date shall forfeit their fees. On presentation of certificate of disability from a qualified Veterinarian or Doctor class entry fees only are refunded.
10. STABLING: Box stalls and limited tack stalls are available at 2 Day stabling for \$30.00 for the weekend. Shavings provided. Stabling is available from noon on Friday. Box stalls will be allocated as entries are received. Exhibitors will supply their own feed. Tack stalls will be available on a limited basis. \$25 Stall Fee refunded upon return of Bridle #'s & stall being stripped on departure.
1 Day Fee Stabling is \$15
11. Concession will be available on grounds through Sunday.
12. All competitors are asked to note the Pelmac rules as posted. Stable areas and barns are to be kept clean and tidy at all times.

What is a Canadian Warmblood?

Bred throughout Europe for over 200 hundred years the Warmblood horse has been bred and recorded regionally in countries such as Germany, Switzerland, Holland, Denmark, Sweden, Poland and Belgium to name a few. Today's warmblood horse has evolved from the farm and military uses to one of sport.

The CWHBA breeding aim is to produce well-bred Warmblood horses, correct in conformation and with quality movement and performance. THE RESULT- a Canadian born horse which, on the basis of its temperament, character, and ride-ability is suitable for Olympic or related Equestrian sports.

The CWHBA is modeled after the very successful European Societies breeding programs. Our goal is to provide the same service and advantages to breeders that our European counterparts enjoy abroad:

- Certificates of pedigree for your valuable Warmblood
- Performance selection and grading
- International standards of Mare and Stallion grading
- Performance records to aid in selection and breeding decisions
- Mare and Foal shows/-Education/Marketing
- Organizational assistance in sales and promotion.

The CHWBA Association is composed of autonomous provincial societies that elect national directors to run the national body. Each provincial association has equal representation on the national board. Local promotions, mare and/or foal shows and sales are provincial responsibilities. Stallion approval and Stud Book management are national matters.
