Biographies

Lorraine Gilchrist has ridden and shown both English and Western, fairly extensively. She has shown everything from grades, Arabians, Appaloosas, Thoroughbreds, and now mostly Quarter Horses. In more recent years Lorraine shows Reiners. Two reasons - they are her love and due to time constraints, I have chosen the favourite class. Lorraine started showing NRHA in 1988 until the present. Her and her partner ranch just outside of Asquith, SK and run a cow/calf operation, as well as raising a limited number to reining/cutting bred Quarter horses. They use the horses as much as possible when working the cows, if for no other reason than to just get them broke. Lorraine has been judging for approximately 30 years, and has been involved with facilitating the seminars for around 12 years.

Jackie Johnson offers a customized entertainment package that combines a hands-on, interactive horse experience, along with exciting, educational, horsemanship demonstrations which focus on tricks. Whether are jumping a full fire jump course (for the hunter/jumper enthusiasts), or doing a display of versatility for the Western folks, her educational, trick training demonstrations are sure to please. Volunteers from the audience might find themselves sitting on the back of a rearing horse, or riding two horses simultaneously in a safe, and controlled, Roman Ride. For those who prefer to watch, learn how she gets her horses comfortable; laying down in front of a large audience, working around fire, performing a wide variety of stunts, tricks, and much, much more. Working with a diversity of breeds and disciplines, Jackie Johnson has something for every audience, of all ages, for every venue.

Mike King is the equine industry programs specialist and a Partner at CAPRI Insurance Services who are the largest insurance provider to the equine industry in Canada.

Currently residing in Ontario, Mike comes with a wealth of knowledge in the insurance industry and has been involved with horses in one way or another for his whole life. Along with his colleagues at Capri, he has been instrumental in the development and implementation of risk management programs and insurance solutions for the equine industry from Coast to Coast.

Pat Michael is began riding as a child. In the early 70's Pat joined the Regina Riding and Driving Club. Since she wasn't interested in jumping, it was suggested that she try Dressage. It has become the focus of her riding ever since. Pat competed up to the Prix St. Georges level and holds a Recorded Judges card in Dressage.

Monica Schlamp is originally from the Grenfell area and is now residing in Estevan. She has two daughters who are involved with Horses, Showing, and Barrel Racing. Monica was raised on a horse ranch, where they bred, trained and showed their own horses. She showed extensively in APHA, AQHA and Open Show Circuits as well as an active 4-H Member. Monica was the leader of the Long Trail 4-H club for 10 years. She started her judging career 17 years ago - Junior Judging under her mother Sandy Assman. Monica is now a Provincial Senior Judge, Equine Canada General Performance Judge, as well as a Certified Coach. Monica coaches kids of all ages and all riding levels right up to the Youth World Show in Oklahoma where her daughter showed a horse they raised and trained.

Dena Kirkpatrick is a AQHA World Champion and Barrel Futurities of America World Champion. She has over 25 years of barrell training experience. Dena has produced 27+ champion horses with combined life-time earnings over \$1.6 million and counting. Includes horses like the famous Willy Nick Bar and Surgar Moon Express, aka "Martha" who is currently the World Champion with Lindsay Sears. Some of Dena's accomplishments are West Texas Futurity - Derby Champion, San Antonio Livestock Show & Rodeo Champion, BFA World Championship Futurity Reserve Champion, Elite Futurity Champion, BFA World Championship Futurity Champion AQHA World Champion, Speedhorse Gold Cup Futurity Reserve Champion, Harlequin Farms Futurity Champion, Old Ft Days Futurity Reserve Champion. Dena holds the record for the only rider/horse to win all 3 go-rounds of the BFA World Championship Futurity. She held a place in the top 10 Ten Futurity Trainers for a consecutive 10 yrs in a row. Dena was a trainer of the Calgary Stampede Champion & Canadian World Champion Lady Perks aka "Beauty". Also, trainer of the WPRA World Champion & AQHA Horse of the Year Sugar Moon Express aka "Martha".

Dr. Greg Douglas graduated from the University of Saskatchewan with a B.Sc., completing his D.V.M. there in 1991. After spending time in practice, he joined the Canadian Food Inspection Agency managing
